³ LPRs, battered noncitizens, and immigrants paroled for 1 year or more may also be eligible for federally funded MinnesotaCare regardless of their date of entry or length of time in the United States if they meet an exemption for military service.

⁴ MinnesotaCare enrollees who become incarcerated while enrolled in federally funded MinnesotaCare, must be switched to state-funded MinnesotaCare until they are released from jail.
